



Stop LAPD Spying Coalition

Dear Commissioner Vice President Paula Madison:

On behalf of the Stop LAPD Spying Coalition, we are deeply disappointed about your disregard and failure to meaningfully respond to community concerns regarding the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD). Concerns that were thoroughly highlighted and substantiated in the coalition's February 24, 2015 letter¹ to the Los Angeles Board of Police Commissioners.

The aforementioned coalition letter included some of the recent examples of LAPD's programs and actions that will have severe negative impact on the long term health and wellbeing of Angelenos. On March 3, 2015 the commission responded² with total lack of sensitivity and any proactive measures, and instead affirmed full support to LAPD's actions and programs. As a reminder following are some of communities' concerns highlighted in the letter:

1. Denial of racial profiling evidenced by the recent Inspector General audit³ of LAPD Suspicious Activity Reporting (SAR) program.
2. Sham "community hearings" on Body Cameras.
3. Increased militarization with acquisition of Drones. Repeatedly Chief Charlie Beck and the commission were publicly exposed misrepresenting and lying.⁴
4. Sabotaging "corrective actions" taken by the department in response to the federal consent decree.⁵

Since your appointment and election as vice president to the LA Board of Police Commissioners in 2013, communities across Los Angeles have implored, demanded, petitioned, and presented evidence of several instances of violation of community members' human and civil rights by the LAPD. Furthermore communities have also approached and reminded you of your obligation to take meaningful and corrective action as a representative of the community, but unfortunately you have and continue to be unresponsive and dismissive of the community.

Your extensive experience in media⁶ as a frontline reporter and executive should be a guide to listen and proactively investigate complaints of how Angelenos are being adversely impacted by LAPD. Your engagement and leadership in women's sport franchise is a marker in understanding obstacles and marginalization many women continue to face.

Your multi-racial heritage⁷ should provide you with a roadmap on how stereotypes and suspicion of the “other” remain embedded in the cultural and body politic of the United States, and how the “other” is policed and controlled. Yet when the coalition presents evidence of disproportionate impact and racial profiling inherent in LAPD programs such as Suspicious Activity Reporting (SAR), where people of color especially African Americans are suspect by default, you remain silent and fail to pay heed to community concerns.

In closing we would again like to remind you of the caution highlighted in the coalition’s February 24th letter – *The country and the city of Los Angeles are at a critical juncture in history. Increasingly people are feeling frustrated, angry, and disillusioned by the façade of civilian oversight and bodies such as the Los Angeles Board of Police Commissioners.*

We sincerely hope that you pay heed to the concerns and issues we raise. We look forward to hearing back from you and request a meeting between you and members of the Stop LAPD Spying Coalition at your earliest availability.
