WHY is the City of Los Angeles Human Relations Commission (HRC) holding a Special Board Meeting on the impacts of Community Policing, Racial Profiling, and Use of Force?

- In April 2013, the **Stop LAPD Spying Coalition** advocated for public hearings to be held by HRC on the LAPD's Suspicious Activity Reporting (SAR) program.
- In October 2013, the HRC Board passed a motion, and in February 2015, the HRC committed to host special board meetings on Racial Profiling, Use of Force, Suspicious Activity Reporting, and Gang Injunctions in two separate meetings with the goal of preparing a report for the Mayor and City Council.
- The June 3rd meeting is the first of those meetings.

This is the community's chance to provide valuable input about the dangers and impact of policing policies and practices, and the dire need for transparency and deep institutional and structural changes in how LAPD operates.
